The Joint Force Training Centre and the Doctrine and Training Centre of the Polish Armed Forces (DTC PAF) have just formally confirmed their intention of close cooperation. On 7 November Major General Pavel Macko, the JFTC Commander, and Major General (ret.) Włodzimierz Szaśiadek, the DTC PAF Director, signed the Letter of Mutual Cooperation which established a basis for current and future relations between both institutions.

The Allied Command Transformation (ACT) has developed a more efficient, effective and affordable Education and Training (E&T) Programme Framework. The new initiatives, including a new concept of Centres of Excellence (COE) known as “Hubs for Education and Individual Training”, require NATO E&T stakeholders to play a more active role within the NATO new E&T Programme Framework.

In addition to the close cooperation with COEs, the JFTC is building up a community of interest with other E&T players. In this context the JFTC and DTC PAF are now establishing relationship that will be beneficial for both parties.

With the two signatures put at the end of the letter both centres embarked on mutual cooperation in the areas of their responsibilities – training and lessons learned. The DTC PAF is invited to support some training events and exercises conducted by the JFTC by deploying personnel to the Analysis and Reporting Section

as well as to the Exercise Control. It has been also decided that the centres will provide mutual support in the area of Doctrine Development.

The cooperation between the centres was already launched. The first event held at the JFTC and supported by the DTC PAF, the PUMA 12 Exercise, started on 7 November. Also this year, the Polish doctrine and training centre will take an active part in the Regional Command North Training Event, which will start in late November.
