



Right before the JFTC started this year's third above battalion level training for advisory teams, a part of the Centre's Training Division had come back from Hohenfels, Germany, where they supported battalion level advisory teams during their pre-deployment training. The Combined Kandak (i.e. Battalion) Military Advisory Team (MAT)/ District Police Advisory Team (PAT) Training Event 12-03 took place between 13 and 27 September at the Joint Multinational Readiness Centre (JMRC).

The JFTC Deputy Commander, Brigadier General Grzegorz Buszka, observed participants' progress during the Culmination Exercise.

This time, 12 Military and 7 Police Advisory Teams, altogether 430 soldiers from Albania, Belgium, Bosnia, Czech Republic, Germany, Hungary, Lithuania, Poland, Romania, Slovakia, Slovenia and the USA, met in Hohenfels to take the NATO centralized training on their future work. The teams will be deployed in Afghanistan in the months to come with the mission of advising, teaching and coaching their counterparts from the Afghan National Army and Afghan National Police at the tactical level.
